
Autumn Term Newsletter

Year

This half term in English, year 7 have been learning about autobiographical writing. We have explored writing in the past tense using first person perspective. We have also learnt about imagery and expanded our vocabulary to use interesting adjectives.

In Geography we have been learning about developed and developing countries, types of employment and reasons for uneven development.





In Maths, Year 7 have been learning about place value and rounding within 1,000,000.

In music, year 7 have learned the key elements of music such as pitch, timbre, tempo, dynamics etc. Students have also learned how to read the notes of a treble clef stave and learned the names of different music notes and music rests, ready to begin playing songs on the keyboard next term!

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
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Year 9!

Year 9 have been learning about Of mice and men in English. Students were really engaged and enjoyed learning about the different personalities of the characters.




In science we have been learning about cells and the organisation of the human body. Students have been working on practice exam questions and using scientific reasoning.




Year 11!

Year 11 have been showing resilience in all areas of the curriculum, and have been working towards their goals in achieving their future aspiration. Year 11 have worked hard on Energy transfers and rates in preparation for Science exams, and have been looking towards STEM careers.

In Geography Year 11 have been learning about climate change and what are the causes for climate change. We have now moved on to earthquakes and volcanos.





Horses For Causes!

At Horses for Causes, the students have been working on interactions between themselves and the horses to promote emotional, physical, and psychological wellbeing. The students have been working as a team to engage in team building activities with the horses. Team building with the horses has been therapeutic as it fosters collaboration, communication, and trust in a unique, engaging environment. Additionally, the students have also spent time grooming the horses. The focus needed for grooming has helped our students to stay present in the moment, providing relief from negative thoughts or worries.







In students 1-1 sessions, we will soon begin towards using the Thrive approach. Some students and year groups will also have small group Thrive sessions alongside their 1-1s. Currently, Mel and Jenny are undertaking training to be Licensed Thrive Practitioners. Thrive is a whole school approach to improving the mental health and wellbeing of young people. Thrive allows staff to understand the needs of pupils and provide targeted support to boost young people's self-awareness and resilience.
